Job Family: Delivering Our Business.

These roles deliver our business through the provision of expertise and support to internal or external stakeholders. This may be through administration, undertaking regulatory services or providing subject matter expertise.

Role Purpose Statement:

To utilise expertise in a professional discipline to recommend and implement business solutions or opportunities for improvement in work practices of internal or external stakeholders.

These roles are often unique based on the expertise of the incumbent.

About the Technical/Subject Matter Expert Roles:

The Technical/Subject Matter Expert roles require an increasing level of expertise and knowledge with a particular emphasis on the increasing ability of the incumbent to apply that knowledge for the development of business solutions, problem resolution, advice and education and to make recommendations for change and innovation at the higher level.

Across the four roles stakeholder liaison also changes from reactive (usually problem solving or the sharing of information internally) through to proactive internal and external liaison (including facilitating outcomes with stakeholders that are beneficial to the VWA).

Environmental context

T/SME 4 often provides a unique contribution based on significant experience and/or qualifications and significant depth and breadth of knowledge. May be seen as an expert in their discipline outside the VWA.

Provides specialist advice on industry and discipline movements and trends, alternative approaches and analysis on risks and options.

Develops and contributes to strategic solutions or innovations which could impact and influence organisational direction, reputation, and relationships with key stakeholders.

Work may generate from a need to develop an organisational initiative or intervention.

Coordinate their work across VWA and often with external stakeholders.

Level of expertise (knowledge and experience)

T/SME 4 has tertiary qualifications which include postgraduate study.

High level of knowledge and expertise in the systems and regulations governing the function, and of the industry and discipline. Applies knowledge of research, analysis and project management techniques.

Should undertake continuous professional development to stay up-to-date.

Autonomy in decision making

T/SME 4 identifies opportunities for VWA based on recent development in industry or discipline trends. May recommend change to strategy, program or policy based on analysis and research. Recommends business solution and initiatives, alternative courses of action and contingency plans.

As a recognised expert their recommendations impact direction of program, projects and possibly strategy within a business unit.
